

# REDRUTH CHARITY RECEIVES PRESTIGIOUS NATIONAL AWARD

Penhaligon's Friends, the Cornish child bereavement service, has been announced as one of only 103 organisations across the UK to win The Queen's Award for Voluntary Service. The award is given to voluntary organisations based on the benefit it gives to the local community.
