## <u>Redruth Town Council</u> <u>Precept Information for Council Tax Bills</u> <u>Financial Year 2022-2023</u>

## Dear Resident

This past year has continued to be a very busy time for councils across the county, with further reductions in income, unplanned expenditure plus additional work created by the pandemic and having to follow government guidelines. However, we have, where possible, continued to provide a service to the parish. We have continued to change and adapt to provide the services that you wish to see in Redruth that are provided locally, and will work to evolve this strategy over the coming years. During the past twelve months, we have extended our Library opening hours, and whilst not able to provide the usual community involvement with festivals and similar are already looking to expand these in the future. We also are looking at the potential to refurbish the public conveniences in New Cut Car Park, and are awaiting notification of funding from central government, though this means that to grasp this opportunity we have had to make a significant contribution ourselves which will result in a one-off increase in this coming year's council tax bill, along with other planned increases.

Therefore, in 2022-2023 we have set a budget which meets the requirements in delivering the services we believe are essential to the parish. We will continue to provide those services devolved to us which we believe are important to you, including the library and information service; public realm CCTV, public toilets, parks and play areas, in addition to ensuring that our other services are not affected. We will continue to provide funding and resources to the main festivals in the town, thereby ensuring that we maintain Redruth's community engagement, with the addition of further community events planned. We will also give support to the Redruth's High Street Heritage Action Zone wherever possible.

Detailed below is the expenditure needed to carry out the work of the Town Council and will be delivered with a yearly increase for 2022-2023 of  $\pounds$ 33.77 for a 'D' Band property which equates to 65 pence per week.
