A very warm welcome to this summer edition of the Redruth Record. Following on from public feedback we are aiming to keep you informed of what's happening around town and there is plenty going on that we would like to tell you about.

March saw us celebrate a most memorable St Piran's Day; if you missed it there are lots of pictures available on social media (see details on the back of the newsletter). A big thank you to everybody who took part.

Last year saw the reintroduction of markets into Redruth; these are currently taking place on the first Saturday of each month and proving a big success, so pop along and check

out the fresh produce, crafts, music and street food. There is also a weekly produce market happening every Thursday in the Market Hall between 10am & 2pm.

We are delighted to announce that work is being undertaken to provide a Youth Café in the town; we will give you more information as it becomes available.

The Kresen Kernow Project at the old brewery site is in the final stages and we are really looking forward to seeing inside the finished building – and being able to access the site to look at those intriguing statues!

Environmental issues are high on the agenda both nationally and locally and as a Town Council we are keen to engage with the local community to find out your views on Climate Change. Please contact me if you have any ideas or views.

If you get the chance to go along to Treskerby, Knight's Way or Trenoweth Estate you will be able to see the excellent job that a new initiative called Green Infrastructure for Growth has been responsible for, helping to promote biodiversity. The bulb and meadow planting, new seating and paths are proving very popular with residents.

We are currently working on a Neighbourhood Plan for the town and if you would like to contribute to this vital piece of work we would like to hear from you.

#### **Redruth Facilities Team**

We have begun 2019 with a number of projects in the pipeline alongside our continuing commitment to maintaining the town centre and green spaces under our control to a high standard.

Work is ongoing to the boundary walls of St Rumon's Gardens to remove the problem of falling masonry and preserve this historic monument for years to come. During this process the Gardens will remain closed, please be patient, we will re-open as soon as it is safe to do so.

The Council's commercial lettings on Market Way are now fully occupied with the imminent arrival of Out Goddess, Baby Discount and AC Mobility (scheduled for early July). This, in conjunction with the weekly Tinners Market in Market Hall, will further enhance this shopping precinct and enable it to go from strength to strength... pop in and have a browse.

Unfortunately, it is not all good news and the blight of vandalism and theft continues to affect our public conveniences in New Cut Car Park. The aim of the Council is to provide safe, clean facilities for the residents of and visitors to the town. The monies collected through charging were meant to be spent on both maintaining and improving the facilities. This is proving impossible as all revenue and a sizeable amount of additional funding is required to repair the damage caused by a small minority of individuals intent on causing damage on a regular basis. I apologise for the recent closures of the facilities and the resultant inconvenience. We are working hard with our partners to resolve the issues and take measures to prevent future problems... bear with us please.

#### **Redruth Library & Information Service**

Redruth Library and Information Service, situated in Clinton Road, is now under the management of Redruth Town Council as part of Cornwall Council's Devolution Programme. The devolution programme is helping councils and communities take over local ownership, management and control of services. The Library is open Tuesday, Thursday and Friday from 9.30am to 5pm, and 10am to 1pm on a Saturday. It is great facility, with very friendly and helpful staff, where you can get FREE access to a wide collection of books, recommendations, exciting events and so much more. They even have the latest films and a fantastic collection of Audiobooks, as well as seven public access computers.

The Library has regular events such as the Young Readers Book Club (ages 10+). The Club meets on the third Thursday of the month from 2pm to 4pm in the Library, with the next 3 meetings being 20<sup>th</sup> June, 18<sup>th</sup> July, and 15<sup>th</sup> August. Redruth Readers meet on the third Thursday of the month between 10:30am and midday; Bookstart Rhymetime sessions for ages 0-4 years and their parents/carers take place every Tuesday between 2pm - 2:45 pm and every Friday between 11am and 11:45am. There is also Redruth LEGO Club, held fortnightly on 1<sup>st</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> June, and 13<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> July, between 10am and midday. We also have a wide range of special events taking place throughout the year including author talks, drop-in events and much more.
