Redruth Facilities Team

Since the June 2019 edition of the newsletter there has been successful completion of some projects and the start of more schemes to improve the town of Redruth.



Work has been completed to the boundary walls of St Rumons Gardens with the skilled masons from Regan Builders removing the vegetation, securing the loose masonry and sealing the tops of the walls with a lime render. Now that the area is safe for users and passers-by our next aim will be to improve the look of the gardens themselves with more colourful, wildlife friendly planting schemes.

Work has begun on the historic Clock Tower on Fore Street. At the time of going to press the scaffolding is imminent with work continuing to repair the internal structure of the building. As the work progresses there will inevitably be times when the clock will have to be stopped. These occasions will be kept to a minimum. Please be patient... it will all be worth it in the end.



The minor vandalism and theft from the public toilets has continued, unfortunately. Of particular concern are the almost constant attempts to prevent the door to the Gents facilities from closing properly. One such attempt resulted in an elderly gentlemen being unable to exit the building until another patron entered and freed the obstruction. Please report any damage to the Town Council and ring 101 to report the vandalism if you see it taking place. Together we can stop this before something more serious happens.

The Summer Reading Challenge is the biggest annual event in the Library calendar – where children are encouraged to continue reading over the summer holidays. The SRC 2019 started on Saturday 13th July and continues until Saturday 14th September. Children are challenged to read six books over that period and are encouraged by stickers and goodies along the way. On completion of the challenge they are awarded a gold medal and once they have returned to school they receive a certificate. We are extremely fortunate to have such an active Young Volunteer Programme and are being supported this year by 10 young volunteers.

We have also launched a very successful Lego Club on alternate Saturdays, have had more live music performed in the Library, are planning a Coding Club taster session on 31st August and are planning lots more "Make and Take" activities.
